Recommendation Review for Discovery Elementary School, Grand Forks

Final Report

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INTRODUCTION

The Grand Forks – East Grand Forks MPO contacted ATAC with intent to review the current status of ATAC's recommendations for Discovery Elementary School, Grand Forks. The study was based on new elementary school site plans (now Discovery Elementary) and was completed in November 2013. The construction of the new premises was completed late summer 2015 and the school started its first session in fall 2015.

RECOMMENDATION REVIEW

The table below provides review of ATAC's recommendations per potential issue as identified during the prior study. In addition to current status of the recommendation and its corresponding implication(s), this review also includes comments by school staff.
